October 31 is Halloween. Should a believer celebrate Halloween? Over the years, we have studied Halloween and the relationship believers should have with it. Several things influence our decisions. First, we must ask, "What does Halloween celebrate?" The answer is, at best, unclear. For the children, it is often about the candy, but it is increasingly becoming something that focuses on the occult. Scripture reminds readers that the spirit world is very real. Good and evil angels battle for dominance. Demon possession was and is a scary reality. Ephesians 6:12 reminds believers that "our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the spiritual forces of wickedness in the heavenly places." Secondly, is the question of whether a believer can celebrate this day to the glory of God. (I Corinthians 10:31). Most holidays have a clear purpose and focal point. This holiday is pointed towards that conflict with biblical truth and good doctrine. With that in mind, let's be careful to make choices that do not diminish our effectiveness as witnesses for Christ. On the other hand, you may have young people coming to your door. It might be wise to give them a sweet treat, but use the occasion to give them a tract as well.
